
Guitar Sight-Reading

Exercise One: Play and name the following notes on strings 3 and 4.


Numbers in circles indicate the string to be played. Numbers beside notes indicate LH fingers.

If using a pick, use alternate-picking as indicated.

Exercise Four:


Count a steady beat in three, and clap this rhythm of half notes, quarter notes and eighth notes.

Write the count under the notes.




Exercise Five: The following exercise uses the notes D E F G and A.
